
CEC o Danal al al Well-Being




Pakistan *r* = -.003 , 95% CI [-.04, .04]



Norway *r* = .23 , 95% CI [.21, .24]






Limitations of current approach:

- 1. Large-scale correlational data do not provide much insight into underlying processes
- 2. We have a very limited view on religiosity/religion/poverty...

→ Let's include people with different views/ religions/ → backgrounds... in our research process!



Approach: Citizen science

- **1. Exploratory approach**: Which processes could be underlying the buffering effect of religiosity?
- 2. Confirmatory approach: Test potential processes in a lab study
- **3. Communicate findings**: Publish popular science article about our findings

Exploratory Study

- Online survey with closed & open-ended questions
- **Sample**: Uganda (N = 62), Germany (N = 50), USA (N = 14)
- Duration: around 20 minutes
- **Compensation**: Voucher lottery + donation to a Ugandan NGO
- Sampling: Promoted via personal contacts, social media, blogs, ...

Exploratory Study – Experience

"This survey has reminded me a lot about my religious beliefs, and for that am grateful."

Exploratory Study – Our Experience

- Difficulties during data collection (especially in the USA)
- Critical German participants 😳
 - Questions too personal (?)
 - Wrong understanding of religiosity (?)

The questions about "wealth" and "poverty" show that you have not yet completely understood the principle of the two categories from a Christian point of view. In the bible/by Jesus Christ it is less about material wealth/material poverty than much more about "spiritual empowerment".





- **1. Exploratory approach**: Which processes could be underlying the buffering effect of religiosity?
- Relevance: Participants perceive that their religious beliefs affect the wellbeing consequences of one's financial situation
 - **Potential processes**: Structure & community, faith & norms, hope & optimism, practical support...
 - Next step: Systematic (qualitative) analysis
- 2. Confirmatory approach: Test potential processes in a lab study
- **3.** Communicate findings: Publish popular science article about our findings
